Ayurved College & Hospital, Bhopal, J.K Town, Sarvadharam, C-Sector, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (Inst.ID:- AYU0489) for intake capacity with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-2025, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of Letter of Permission to start 05 New PG courses with 23 seats in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats, (ii) Kriya Sharir-05 seats, (iii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-05 seats, (iv) Swasthavritta-05 seats and (v) Shalakya Tantra-03 seats from the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

- I am to refer to your application vide ref. no. LNAC/2023/490 dated 31.08.2023, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely L.N. Ayurved College & Hospital, Bhopal, J.K Town, Sarvadharam, C-Sector, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID:- AYU0489) for issuance of Letter of Intent to start 05 New PG courses with 23 seats in the subjects namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-05 seats (iv) Swasthavritta-05 seats and (v) Shalakya Tantra-03 seats from the academic session 2024-25, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent on 27.12.2023 & 28.12.2023 through hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and as you were fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria, the Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued to your college vide letter of even no. dated 20.03.2024.
- Further, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the college on **09.05.2024 and 10.05.2024 through Hybrid mode** to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities available as a part of annual visitation for **issuance of conditional permission for intake capacity with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course** for the academic session 2024-2025, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and **for issuance of Letter of Permission (LOP) to start 05 New PG courses with 23 seats in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-05 seats (iv) Swasthavritta-05 seats and (v) Shalakya Tantra-03 seats** from the academic session 2024-2025 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020.

respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 9. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 12. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2025-26:-
 - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016:
 - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2.
- 13. This permission to start 05 New PG courses with 23 seats in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-05 seats (iv) Swasthavritta-05 seats (v) Shalakya Tantra-03 seats from the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2024-25 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.
- 14. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2025-26.
