

attendance upto 10% and a further 5% can be condoned by the Head of the Department and Vice-Chancellor of the University respectively for satisfactory reasons.

- 13 Notwithstanding anything stated in this Ordinance for any unforeseen issues arising and not covered by this Ordinance or in the event of differences of interpretation, the Vice-Chancellor may take a decision. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.
- 14 There shall be at least fourteen weeks of teaching in every semester.
- 15 In every semesters, deficiency upto one mark (in both theory as well as practical) can be condoned to the best of the advantage of the students for passing the exams.
- 16 One grace mark can be condoned to the candidate by VC who is failing/missing distinction/missing first division at the completion of the course. This benefit will not however, be available to a candidate getting advantage under clause 15.
- 17 Notwithstanding anything stated in this Ordinance for any unforeseen issues arising and not covered by this Ordinance or in the event of differences of interpretation, the Vice-Chancellor may take a decision. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

ORDINANCE NO.108

MASTER OF DESIGN UNDER FACULTY OF ARCHITECTURE & PLANNING

1. INTRODUCTION :

The CBSC provides a flexible type approach in which the student can take courses of their choice, learn at their own pace, undergo additional courses and acquired more than the required credits, and adopt an interdisciplinary approach to learning. The courses shall be evaluated on the grading system, which is considered better than the conventional marks system. It is necessary to introduce the grading system to make the uniformity among all technical institutions of India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, this document is in accordance to the guidelines of LNCT University, Bhopal B. Arch & Tech Ordinance.

2. Duration

- The duration for Master of Design Programme shall be Two Years Maximum Period of programme completion: Four Years.
- The Student admitted to 1st year M. Des shall complete the course within a period of three academic years from the date of first admission, failing which he/she has to discontinue the course.
