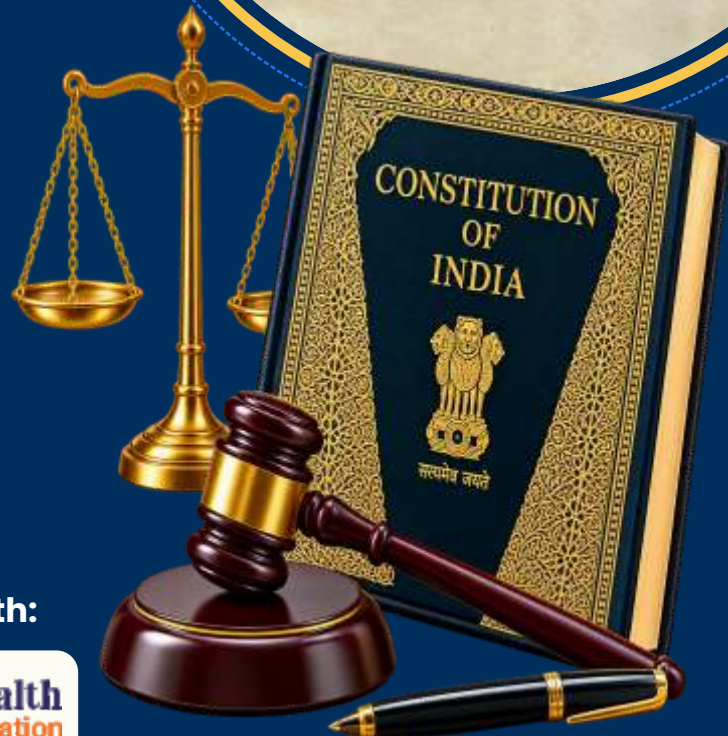

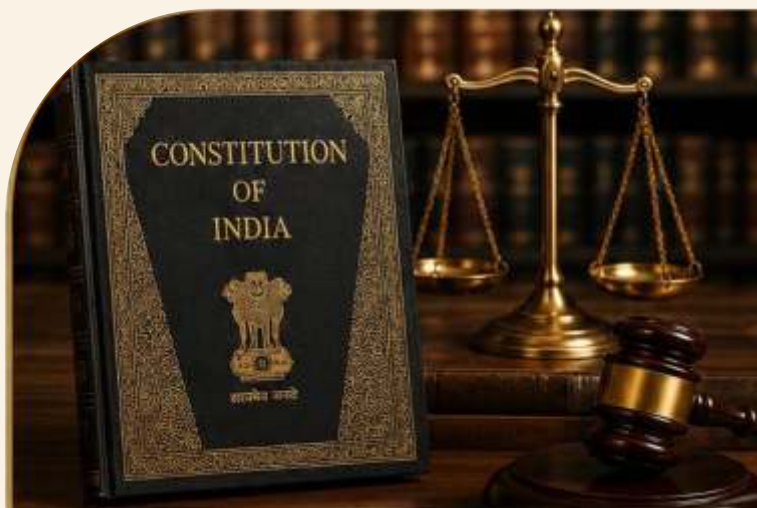

About the Conference

A working platform for ideas, dialogue and impact.

The LNCT Constitutional Law Conference is a two-day international academic gathering that brings together scholars, judges, practitioners, policymakers, researchers and students to deliberate on the evolution of Indian constitutional law and its global relevance.

Day One is a peer-reviewed research conference featuring parallel technical sessions across sixteen sub-themes, each chaired by a senior academic, advocate or member of the judiciary.

Day Two is a public judicial dialogue in the form of a curated lecture series and panel discussions, envisaged to become an annual intellectual tradition.

The conference is outward-looking. It examines how Indian constitutional principles are received, adapted or distinguished across Commonwealth jurisdictions, and how they can respond to emerging global challenges in the 21st century.

- Abstract in English (maximum 300 words).
- A4 paper with one-inch margins.
- Times New Roman, font size 12.
- Include title, author(s), affiliation and keywords.
- APA citation style for full paper.
- Full length paper approximately 3,000–5,000 words.
- AI Usage Report and Plagiarism Report (maximum 10% similarity) mandatory.
- Maximum two co-authors.
- Each co-author must register separately.
- At least one co-author must present physically.
